

Fantasy Author Guest of Honour

Katherine Kurtz is the author of the Deryni Series, the Adept Series, the Templar Series, and several other works. She defined and established her own sub-genre of "historical fantasy" set in close parallels to our own medieval period and featuring "magic" that much resembles what some of us might call extrasensory perception. Additionally Katherine utilized her historical training to develop another sub-genre she calls "crypto-history," in which the "history behind the history" intertwines with the "official" histories.

Katherine is perhaps best known for the Deryni novels. For those who have not read *Deryni Archives*, Katherine had what she describes as a "very vivid dream" on October 16, 1964, after which she wrote some notes on two "3 X 5" cards. Several years later, she wrote

or ee she rote

the novella "The Lords of Sorandor," recognizable parts of which appear in Deryni Rising.

Author / Film Maker



Scott MacMillan (sometimes known as Mr. Katherine Kurtz) was educated at the University of Southern California and the American Film Institute. He has been a film-maker, an award-winning editor of Western fiction, a world-class black-powder shootist, a mounted police officer, a novelist, a screenwriter, a reserve army officer, a vintage car enthusiast, an expert on antique arms and armour, and an avid student of heraldry, military history, crumbling castles, chivalry, and Scottish and Irish heritage. While living in Ireland, he served as a Herald of Arms in the Office of the Chief Herald of Ireland.

Now that he and Katherine are mostly settled in their new home in Virginia, readers might look forward to the long-awaited third Nazi Vampire book in the not-too-distant future. Meanwhile, Scott is working on several potential

film projects while he explores the differences between Scottish and Southern gentlemen.
