This is our annual family/ community reunion and the high point of the year for many of us.







KEYCON CODE OF CONDUCT

BEHAVIOUR AT KEYCON

Keycon makes the provision of safety for all of its members paramount. Membership in the Convention in no way supersedes the law. Any action which threatens the safety of anyone during the convention by a convention member or by an outsider to a member of Keycon will be dealt with promptly. This may include: revoking of memberships, banning from future conventions, and police action where appropriate.

Keycon welcomes members from diverse communities. Any action that negatively targets individuals based on their gender, sexuality, race, creed, religion, etc., will NOT be tolerated.

Keycon expects its members to behave in a civilized fashion and to treat each other respectfully. Additionally, the hotel is not dedicated completely to our use for the weekend. Members of the general public stay in and visit the hotel to dine and socialize. Please be considerate of both attendees and non-attendees at all times.

KEYCON ATTENDEE'S CREED:

1. Do Good

2. Avoid Doing Evil3. Don't Destroy the Hotel

HARASSMENT & OTHER INCIDENTS

Harassment is NOT tolerated. Harassment is generally any behaviour that alarms or annoys another person or group. This includes:

unwanted physical contact (including non-consensual hugs)

threatening to physically attack someone

following a person or group without a legitimate reason

using hate speech

Some of these things can occur unintentionally, but persistent unwanted behaviour will be considered harassment. If you are unsure if your presence or behaviour is wanted or appropriate, then ask, or stop and seek advice from someone else. If you approach someone and they tell you "no" or "leave me alone", your business with them is done. If you do not leave them alone as they have requested, then your behaviour becomes grounds for a harassment complaint. That you did not mean to alarm them in the first place no longer matters.

Please report any incidents in which a member of the convention is: abusive, insulting, intimidating, bothersome or acting in an unsafe or illegal manner. Keycon reserves the right to revoke, without refund, the membership of anyone for any reason, including harassment. Persons violating the law will be turned over to the Police or Hotel Security. Assault is considered a criminal matter(s) and will be treated as such.

HOW DO I REPORT AN INCIDENT?

All incidents and issues fall under the responsibility of Keycon Operations (OPS). OPS functions out of Room 1510 and can be contacted 24 hours a day during the convention. A member of OPS and/or the Convention Committee (ConComm) will be available throughout the convention. OPS' phone numbers are posted at the entrance to all elevators and in bathrooms throughout the convention space as well as on the door to 1510. OPS members will wear a separate, distinguishing ID Badge.

If someone has become too boisterous or needs an escort to a room or taxi, these are the individuals to call. OPS will also respond to any incidents where this code of conduct has been violated. If you cannot find a member of OPS, we encourage you to seek out a member of the ConComm. They will ensure that you are put in touch with OPS promptly.

When you report, please discuss the incident with OPS. If appropriate, they will attempt to resolve the issue informally, on-site. If that is not appropriate, they will ensure that you are in a safe place and resolve how best to proceed. If, for any reason, you cannot or do not wish to speak to a member of OPS, please speak with the Hotel's Front Desk person to request Security or call 911 if it is an emergency.

For more serious or on—going matters, or for matters that do not need to be resolved at Keycon, we will either write out a statement for you to approve and sign, or ask you to write out your own complaint and provide a copy for OPS to follow—up on.

KEYCON CODE OF CONDUCT

INCIDENT REPORTING/FOLLOW-UP AFTER KEYCON ENDS

If you are reporting after the Convention, or following—up an earlier complaint, the same general structure applies. Report to OPS, or to a ConComm member and record the incident. If you are unsatisfied with the response from Operations, you can make a written complaint to the WinSFA Senate for reconsideration.

OPS will respond/intervene in the event of a sexual assault and to protect your rights. If this occurs, we encourage you to report the assault as soon as possible afterwards. A member of OPS or ConComm will ensure that you are safely escorted to the police or hospital of your choosing and without judgment.

Please note that Keycon and it's volunteers have a responsibility to respond to incidents that occur in Keycon's Convention space only. This means in the areas hosting Convention held activity spaces. The Convention's areas do not include: private Guest Hotel Rooms, Hotel Staff Only/off–limit areas, Hotel run areas like the restaurant etc., or off–site area(s). We cannot be responsible for private disputes between people that occur around the Convention however, we are prepared to assist anyone in need. We also reserve the right to take any appropriate steps involving anyone whose attendance at Con may endanger the well–being of themselves, other members, and/or property which may result in removal from the Convention and/or contacting the appropriate authorities.

KEYCON POLICIES

BADGE POLICY

Badging will be in effect in all areas of the Convention and at all times. This means that you must wear your badge from Opening Ceremonies until the end of the Dead Dog. You will also be **required** to show a valid government issued Photo ID for adult—oriented panels and Hospitality suites. If you lose your badge you will need to purchase a replacement from the Registration Desk.

Replacement Badge Pricing:

1st Replacement: \$ 15.00

2nd Replacement: Full Membership Price

Badges are non-transferable. Persons found trading or sharing badges will have their membership(s) revoked without refund. Anyone caught in the Convention activity spaces including the 15th Floor without a badge (Ghosting) will be asked to produce their badge or leave the Convention held areas.

WEAPONS & ACCESSORIES POLICY

Keycon has for a long time enjoyed a history of accessorized costumes with next—to—no safety accidents or incidents. Let's work together to keep it that way for everyone's enjoyment. You are responsible for your accessories. Watch where your bow or staff is pointing to keep the ankle bruising and noggin—knockin' to a bare minimum, and ensure that your replica weapon does not break any laws. It is **required** that you peace-bond your blades i.e.: sheathed, scabbarded, secured against accidental discharge, etc. If you need help peace-bonding your weapon, please see OPS and they will help you out.

ALCOHOL POLICY

Keycon's Hospitality suites are **required** to practice "It's Good Business" smart-serving and are well informed about the rules concerning mixing alcohol and minors. The rule is: alcohol mixes, minors don't. Equally heinous is the over–serving of a person who is already intoxicated. Hospitality suites will be carefully checking badges and valid government issued Photo IDs. If a Hospitality suite has been found directly serving alcohol to a minor or is found over–serving a patron, that Hospitality suite will be shutdown immediately and for the duration of the Convention.

KEYCON POLICIES (CONTINUED)

SMOKING POLICY

Smoking under the City of Winnipeg Smoking Regulation By-law is allowed in designated outdoor areas and in specifically designated "smoking" private Guest Hotel Rooms. Please remember to time your smoke breaks accordingly to allow for travel time especially at peak periods on the elevators. Smoking is permitted on the Radisson Terrace and outside the Hotel at ground level.

APPROPRIATE DRESS

The wearing of costumes and creative apparel is strongly encouraged and celebrated at Keycon each year. However, all costumes and apparel must cover a Member's body – there can be no nudity (partial or otherwise_ in the *common space* areas of the Hotel. Note that all publicly accessible areas in the Hotel are considered common space. The only areas not included in the common space definition are: private Guest Hotel Rooms, Meeting Rooms and Hospitality suites on the 15th Floor. Any nudity in the Meeting rooms and in Hospitality suites will only be allowed during the 18+ programming. Membership in the Convention in no way supersedes the law. Badging and proof of age will be necessary for admittance to those areas during 18+ programming areas. The Hotel has said that anyone who does not follow this dress code will be asked to leave the Hotel immediately.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Photography, videotaping and/or image capturing via electronic means are not permitted in the Art Show area. To protect the safety of the Masquerade participants, we do not allow flash photography during the Masquerade. Ask permission before photographing/videotaping our Guests of Honour or anyone else at the Convention. Do not use tripods and other bulky equipment where they might impede access to seats, doors and aisles in the event a room must be evacuated.

CHILDREN AS FANS

Children under 12 years old may attend with a free "Babes–In–Arms" Membership with **and** under the supervision of their legal parent/guardian at all times. Keycon requires that there be at least one (1) person with an Adult Membership accompanying every "Babes–In–Arms" Member.

Parents of children aged 12—17 years old who believe their children are mature enough may choose to allow their children to freely roam the Convention on their own. The parent/guardian who signs for the free–roaming child(ren) does so with the understanding that any child who excessively misbehaves or engages in inappropriate, disruptive or dangerous behaviour is subject to having their free–roaming privileges or their entire membership revoked. Some program items dealing with adult–themed topics may be closed to individuals under the age of 18. When needed a valid government Photo ID will be required to access these events.

LIABILITY

Neither Keycon nor the Hotel shall be responsible for any items lost or damaged in the public areas of the Hotel, neither in the Hotel's parking lot, nor in any other parking area during attendance at Keycon. All attendees will take responsibility for their own possessions. If another attendee damages your possessions, it is your responsibility to seek recompense from them directly. If an attendee damages Hotel property, they shall be held personally accountable for their actions and be responsible for repaying any debts so incurred.

OPERATIONS (OPS)

Operations (OPS) functions out of Room 1510 on the 15th Floor and can be contacted 24 hours a day during the convention. They will be identifiable at the Convention, and telephone contact for them will be public, and posted at Registration, the elevators, and in the Convention's public bathrooms. OPS is also responsible for enforcing the *Code of Conduct*. Any complaints or concerns about people's activities should be brought to OPS' attention. Badging will be in effect and peace-bonding checks will be carried out by OPS.

VOLUNTEERS

KEYCON IS RUN BY VOLUNTEERS JUST LIKE YOU

Our convention, as always, lives and dies on the participation and energy of volunteers. Everyone involved, from ConComm, to the Hospitality hosts and those grabbed on Sunday afternoon to help with cleanup, is volunteering an immense amount of time and energy to ensure another successful convention, however, we always need more people at Con to keep events running smoothly. If you have any particular area that you would like to help with, please feel free to contact us through Operations or the department themselves.

WINSFA - THE SENATE

The Winnipeg Science Fiction and Fantasy Association (WINSFA) Senate is the Board of Directors for Keycon, which provides assistance to the Co-chairs, administers the Equity fund for Keycon, and chooses the Co-chairs and Treasurer for Keycon. All the members of the senate have had either a long-term commitment to fandom in Winnipeg, or experience in the running of Keycon or other fan-run conventions. The Senate meets at least once per month. We believe this provides a continuity and stability for the convention, allowing it to continue for now 30+ years where many other conventions in recent years have either floundered or shut down completely.

SENATE ELECTIONS ON SATURDAY

Each year the WINSFA Senate holds its Annual General Meeting (AGM) at Keycon, open to all registered members. At the AGM we hold an 'Election from the Floor' – the nomination by the attendees and voting for two convention members to be elected to the Senate for a One (1) Year Term. Newly elected Senators will have an opportunity to participate in Senate meetings, put forth their ideas and have a hand in shaping the continuous, ongoing processes that contribute to Keycon's continuity and other fandom activities. At the end of their term, they are given an opportunity to report back to the Convention Membership at Keycon about their experiences and thoughts about the Senate and its work.

All Keycon Members are encouraged to attend the AGM and participate in the election process

WANT TO BE CONCHAIR?

The WINSFA Senate is seeking two or more person teams interested in running for position of ConChairs for Keycon 2018. The details about the obligations and responsibilities of running Keycon is outlined in the Constitution and is available on request. Note that all interested candidates must apply with their co-candidate. Single applications will not be accepted.

Please be aware that Senate would require a letter with the full names of the two or more prospective Co-Chairs and current contact information for each candidate. The letter should be dated and signed by both candidates. The letter of intent for ConChair Candidacy must be received by an active member of the WINSFA Senate or by either of the current ConChairs: John Mansfield or John Speelman, by 11:59 pm on Sunday May 22, 2016.

PETER DAVID, AUTHOR

Peter David is a prolific author whose career, and continued popularity, spans nearly two decades. He has worked in every conceivable media: Television, film, books (fiction, non-fiction and audio), short stories, and comic books, and acquired followings in all of them.

In the literary field, Peter has had over fifty novels published, including numerous appearances on the New York Times Bestsellers List. His novels include Sir Apropos of Nothing (A "fast, fun, heroic fantasy satire" — Publishers Weekly) and the sequel The Woad to Wuin, Knight Life, Howling Mad, and the Psi-Man adventure series. He is the co-creator and author of the bestselling Star Trek: New Frontier series for Pocket Books, and has also written such Trek novels as Q-Squared, The Siege, Q-in-Law, Vendetta, I, Q (with John deLancie), A Rock and a Hard Place and Imzadi. He produced the three Babylon 5 Centauri Prime novels, and has also had his short fiction published in such collections as Shock Rock, Shock Rock II, and Otherwere: Stories of Transformation, as well as Isaac

Asimov's Science Fiction Magazine and The Magazine of Fantasy and Science Fiction.

JULIE CZERNEDA, AUTHOR

Since 1997, Canadian author and former biologist Julie E. Czerneda has shared her love and curiosity about living things through her science fiction, published by DAW Books, NY. Recently, she began her first fantasy series: Night's Edge with A Turn of Light, which won the 2014 Aurora Award for Best English Novel.

Play of Shadow followed, winning the 2015 Aurora.

While there'll be more fantasy, Julie's back in science fiction to complete her Clan Chronicles series. Reunification #1: This Gulf of Time and Stars, was released Nov 2015, with #2: The Gate to Futures Past out this September.





JEAN-PIERRE NORMAND, ARTIST

Jean-Pierre Normand is a professional illustrator, specializing in science fiction and fantasy for the past 30 years. Over two hundred book and magazine covers featuring his work has been published in Canada, United States and France. His paintings has been shown at various conventions and other exhibits, winning several awards, notably the Aurora for artistic achievement in Canada in 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2001 and 2004. His work was published in « Spectrum, the best in contemporary fantasy art »,and appeared on the covers of "Asimov's Science Fiction", "Analog", "On Spec" and "Science fiction Chronicle".

This year's program book, poster and t-shirt art were all generously provided by Jean-Pierre Normand.

GUESTS OF HONOUR:



KARL JOHANSON, EDITOR

Bio by Dr. Robert Runté, Senior Editor at Five Rivers Publishing (abridged)

Karl Johanson is not just an exceptional editor of a marvelous magazine, he is—behind his unassuming exterior—a mad genius whose team is, against all logic, constantly pulling off these completely astounding projects. Karl has this quiet way of just doing stuff that shouldn't be possible.

During the 1990s, Karl co-edited the Canadian SF newsletter, Under the Ozone Hole with John Herbert. The UTOH team, which included Stephanie Johanson as illustrator and Monica Spencer as proofreader, racked up an astonishing four Aurora Awards during its run. By providing news, reviews, and eclectic (often satirical) content, UTOH was one of the key factors in developing a cohesive national Canadian fandom.

In 1994 Karl applied to work at Sanctuary Woods Multimedia, because once again, why not ask? While chatting with the general manager, Karl happened to

mention that one of his hobbies was spotting science flaws in SF shows such as Star Trek, and trying to justify them during the commercials. He had the job before he got home: turned out part of the job was to 'science up' the ideas of head writer, Lee Sheldon's (whose writing credits include work on Star Trek: The Next Generation) so they were scientifically valid—or at least plausible.

I asked Karl shortly after what he was working on at Sanctuary Woods, and he told me he was coming up with a list of technologies that would likely be available twenty years in the future. I couldn't believe he was getting paid to do something that cool. Just because it never occurs to him not to ask. (Karl still regularly runs amusing and informative "Justify the Science Flaw" panels at conventions, some of which can be seen at his YouTube channel: www.youtube.com/karljohanson42.

After Sanctuary Woods, Karl worked for Disney Interactive. The studio's manager referred to Karl as a Swiss Army Knife because Karl could do whatever he needed done at the moment. Much of what Karl did was fact check educational computer games. I know the content that got through Karl was accurate, because my daughters played those games.

When Disney Interactive's studio in Victoria closed, Karl and wife Stephanie decided to start Neo-opsis Science Fiction Magazine. They showed me their business plan and I explained to them, in minute detail, how such a business could not possibly work. I believe they are now working on issue #27...

Of course, it is as editor of Neo-opsis that Karl is Editor Guest at your convention.

Neo-opsis focuses on Canadian writers, and frequently features work by Canadian superstars such as: Spider Robinson, Dave Duncan and Matthew Hughes, but includes fiction from all over the world. Neo-opsis has also helped launch the careers of dozens of emergent writers; indeed, one of the distinguishing characteristics of Neo-opsis is their persistent efforts to provide constructive feedback on submissions, which—as any acquisition editor will tell you—is above and beyond the job description.

Neo-opsis includes SF convention and book reviews (including, I am proud to say, a dozen I contributed) and Karl's regular science column—which is unlike any other science column, ever. Not only a fan favourite, Neo-opsis also manages to attract readers new to SF&F. If you are not already familiar with the magazine, I urge you to pick it up: it's good to hold something impossible in your hands.

And if you haven't talked to Karl yet, allow me to assure you that he is completely approachable. He's easy-going, upbeat, and thoughtful public speaker, and an entertaining raconteur. He loves science and science fiction and has a wide-ranging knowledge that makes him the Swiss-Army Knife of panelists. And he is, of course, one hell of an editor.





SPECIAL NOTE

In all Categories; with the only exception being for Junior, the costume must have been homemade by the contestant(s) or a professional seamstress/tailor(s). Store bought costumes will **not** be eligible for judging. The final decision of your Category level will be decided by the Masquerade Director Carol Leblond.

The walk—through and judging will take place prior to The Masquerade. All contestants are required to attend in full costume in order to be judged and to help ensure the show will run smoothly. All categories other than the Fan Favourite and Performance will be judged at this time.

CATEGORIES

JUNIOR:

- Contestants must be under the age of 13
- If the costume was made by an adult or the contestant wishes to be judged on workmanship it will be judged in the appropriate category (Novice, Journeyman or Master)
- Costume must be age appropriate to wearer

NOVICE:

- To be entered in this category the contestant may **not** have won any previous masquerades or similar costume contests
- Costumes created by someone other than the model will be accepted and judged at the appropriate level

JOURNEYMAN:

- To be entered in the Journeyman category
 the contestant must have won at least one

 (1) award
 but no more than three (3) in a
 Masquerade or similar costume contest
- Costumes created by someone other than the model(s) will be accepted and judged at the appropriate level

MASTER:

- To be entered into the Master category the contestant must have won three (3) or more awards at a Masquerade or similar costume contest
- Designer(s) who are professional seamstress(es)/costumer(s) will be judged in this category automatically
- Costumes created by someone other than the model(s) will be accepted and judged at the appropriate level

REGISTRATION

Contestants can find the Masquerade Registration Forms available at the Registration Desk. You may also register online until Thursday May 19, 2016 at 11:59 PM.

All hard copy filled-out Registration Forms must be received by the Masquerade Director by 1:00 PM on Saturday May 21, 2016.

Failure to present your Registration Forms will result in exclusion from the judged event.



EXTRAVAGANZA: THE MASQUERADE

MASQUERADE RULES

Surprise the audience/judges, but not the Masquerade Director.

If you are planning something particularly "unique", it must be discussed and approved in advance.

All Masquerade entrants including models, must have be Keycon Members and will be expect to show their Registration Badge in advance of participating in The Masquerade on Saturday afternoon.

No open flame, fire, flash powder or flash paper is allowed.

No messy substances allowed – do **not** use messy or sticky substances that drip, ooze or spray from the costume. This includes directly or indirectly targeting the audience, other contestants and the judges.

No nudity or exposing genitals or buttocks to the audience or judges. No costume is NO COSTUME! No "mooning" or flashing the audience, other contestants or judges.

No touching of other contestants.

Nothing is to be done that may cause damage or create a disturbance.

While weapons will be allowed on stage, they must be checked by our Masquerade Director first. We reserve the right to disallow contestants under the age of 18 from carrying weapons on stage. We reserve the right to disallow weapons at our discretion.

No live creatures; other than human beings, will be allowed backstage or on stage with the only exception being Service Animals (who should be wearing items that denote their status).

Complete costumes that have been purchased or rented may be shown in the Masquerade but will not be eligible for judging. Commissioned costumes (purchased and modeled) or select purchased pieces in a costume are allowable, but the costume as a whole must be a work of individual(s) creation.

The Masquerade Director reserves the option to eliminate anyone from competition on the basis of taste, danger to the contestant/audience/other contestants or for any other reason deemed sufficient.

The Masquerade also reserves the right to change these rules as necessary and will notify contestants of any changes promptly.


Contestants may bringing a copy of their chosen musical selection on a USB Drive or CD to have played during their skit. No audio will be played if there is no received music/sound effects/audio recording.

All contestants understand upon signing the Masquerade Registration Form that they will be photographed, video taped, and/or digitally recorded. Members of the audience may also end up on a recording and should act accordingly. If there is someone in the audience/other contestant that is acting in a manner that is inappropriate or harassing using a device or by deed, OPS will be notified and the person/persons will be escorted out of the Masquerade.


